GRETCHEN THE GREENHORN (1916)

Set in the tenements of New York, Gretchen the Greenhorn is the delightful story of a recent immigrant to America. Dorothy Gish is Gretchen, a good-natured Dutch girl whose new life is full of hardship, but also friendship and romance. When Gretchen and her father fall prey to counterfeiters, only friends can save them. This beautifully photographed melodrama is one of the few surviving films of Dorothy Gish, as popular an actress in her day as her sister Lillian. You may never get another chance to see this very rare feature again! Also showing: coming attraction trailers for lost films Just Another Blonde (1926), The Patriot (1928) and Beau Sabreur (1928). LUCKY STAR (1929)

Presented in association with the Pordenone Silent Film Festival

Lucky Star is a charming story you won't want to miss! Janet Gaynor is Mary, a poor farm girl who befriends Tim, a kind-hearted veteran played by Charles Farrell. The two forge a unique and caring relationship until Mary's domineering mother and Tim's old army rival threaten to destroy their happiness. As Scott Eyman writes, director Frank Borzage "shows us two people falling in love, and makes us fall in love with them, too." The poetic landscape of farms, forests and streams was constructed entirely in the studio. Considered lost until 1990, Lucky Star was rediscovered in the Netherlands and restored for its premier revival at the Pordenone Silent Film Festival in Italy. We're happy to present this film as a Pordenone highlight, especially at the Castro Theatre where Janet Gaynor got her start in the movies - as an usherette!

BEN-HUR (1925)

One of the most lavishly produced films of all time, *Ben-Hur* features a cast of thousands, magnificent sets and astonishing special effects. Ramon Novarro is Ben-Hur, a Jewish prince who survives banishment to seek revenge for the persecution of his family. Francis X. Bushman is his nemesis, the Roman Centurion Messala. Containing some of the most thrilling scenes ever put on film, the spectacular chariot race alone is worth the price of admission. 42 cameras were used to simultaneously capture the action! In 1987, *Ben-Hur* was restored to its original brilliance by film historians Kevin Brownlow and David Gill, in collaboration with the Czechoslovakian Film Archive and Turner Entertainment Co. This restoration includes the original color tints and beautiful two-strip Technicolor sequences. Not shown in San Francisco during its revival tour, here's your chance to see this legendary classic!

DENNIS JAMES

Dennis James performs internationally as an organ and piano soloist in addition to accompanying and directing chamber ensembles and major symphony orchestras. In 1981, he was organist for the world revival tour of *Napoleon*. This July, he will appear at Radio City Music Hall for the American Guild of Organists 100th anniversary celebration.
